The international non-governmental organisations (INGOs) at the Council of Europe also met only online this year. Our Andante representatives Sybille Bader Biland and Sabine Slawik were able to be present. The dominant topic here was also the Covid-19 pandemic and its effects. The catastrophic situation in the Moria camp, the new Mediterranean refugee routes and the European Refugee Passport, which enables medical staff to gain a foothold in their new homeland more quickly, were also topics considered.

However, the crisis also shows that the situation of particularly vulnerable groups, namely children and women affected by violence and abuse, has deteriorated further. Here it is important to call on those responsible to take stronger protective measures, such as highlighting the need for the

Istanbul Convention to be implemented. Bulgaria, Poland, Slovakia and Hungary are lagging behind in this respect as well as in the recognition and participation of religious groups.
